# **Organisational Health Checks and Audits**

Many of the development that you will read about in the newsletter are all about ways we can try to future-proofing our members, charities and local organisations, and above all being absolutely determined to offer ever greater value to our members

One way we are aiming to do this is by offering Organisational Assessments/Audits aimed at helping organisations get into shape, be more effective and successful. The Assessment is an objective and non-judgemental review of the strengths and weaknesses of your organisation to enable you to address issues of relevance to your organisation.

The process will also enable you answer questions such as:

- are we meeting legal requirements?
- are we managing our organisation according to good practice?
- are there gaps in the way that we manage our organisation, activities or services?
- where do our strengths lie?
- in which areas do we need to improve?
- what are our priorities for the future?
- what are our training needs?

The CVS would like to encourage members and others to take advantage of this

service as it supports forward planning for change, effective resource management, embracing new funding opportunities i.e. corporate sponsorship and crowd funding.

Organisations and groups will be required to sign up to working with the CVS to draw up an action plan which includes a review of business plans and completing the organisational assessment within three months.

# Basildon Emergency Night Shelter (BENS) set to expand this winter

You may have read in the YELLOW Advertiser that the winter shelter scheme for homeless people in Basildon will be extended this year to run for five nights a week instead of three. We are pleased to be able to report that Basildon Council has awarded two grants to help fund the project.

Last year's scheme provided 52 people with shelter, with the longest-staying guest staying for 33 nights. The average stay was six or seven nights.

One person who stayed at the shelter last year told the organisers they believed it had saved their life, commenting: "If it wasn't for you and all the volunteers, I wouldn't be here now."

The project is being led by the borough's Homelessness Working Group. This is a group made up of a range of local providers including Project 58:7, the Citizen's Advice Bureau, the Helping Hands Food Bank, Basildon Council's Housing Options Manager, Basildon's Community Development Team and the Basildon Drugs and Alcohol Service.

All the sites are all central to Basildon, which is where the provision is most needed so it's great that the council is prepared to invest in this scheme. In addition to providing overnight shelter, the project tries to help visitors tackle their problems and improve their circumstances.

Part of the project objectives is to support the guests and identify whether they've got ongoing support needs. One of our partners last year, the homelessness charity St Mungo's, managed to help a number of the guests' progress from the street to secure accommodation."

## CHIEF OFFICER'S UPDATE

Basildon Council helped fund the project as a means to reduce homelessness, improve health and wellbeing in the borough and reduce the need for the guests to use other 'high cost public services'.

To progress the project **we are recruiting a BENS Project Coordinator.** The aim of the post will be to set up and ensure the smooth running of the Basildon Emergency Night Shelter (BENS) provision in Basildon Borough that will be running from Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2017 to Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018.

In recognition of the important contribution to the scheme last winter, Volunteers were nominated for the Basildon Volunteer of the Year awards. Best of luck to them at the awards ceremony on 17 October!



# **Brentwood Mental Health and Wellbeing Small Grant Scheme 2017**

Brentwood Borough Council is committed to working with partners to help improve mental health and wellbeing within the local community.

Brentwood's Mental Health and Wellbeing Small Grant Scheme has been set up to give Brentwood Communities the opportunity to promote local initiatives to support the mental health and wellbeing of people living within the Borough. The fund has £10,000 available in total in the current financial year and grant of up to £1,200 is available for applicants.



2017, when a decision on the allocation of funding will be made. Applicants should expect to receive a response to their submitted application by the latest of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2017.

The Council is inviting bids from individuals, groups and organisations for a share of the funding on offer for local causes and projects that will support and improve mental health and wellbeing for local people. All applications must benefit Brentwood's communities. Project must be delivered in the Borough and take place between 1st November 2017 – 1<sup>st</sup> November 2018.

The maximum amount that can be applied for is £1,200. There is no minimum amount.

# High Sheriff of Essex Awards Scheme is now open

The High Sheriff of Essex Awards Scheme is now open for applications. Due to the number of Funds that the ECF now manage which support community safety related projects, the amount that voluntary groups can apply for has increased to £5,000.

These grants are to support those working to make their communities safer and better places in which to live.

Projects which have received grants previously include diversionary activities for young people, schemes which highlight the dangers of financial scams, educational programmes about drug and alcohol misuse and initiatives which support victims of crime.

# **Sport England Inactivity Funding workshops – Thursday 5th October**

Sport England has announced the £3 million inactivity funding which will support inactive people from lower socio-economic groups. They are looking for partners who can reach them and help change their lives for the better.

- £2 million will support larger projects from £25,000 up to a maximum of £500,000 aimed at **inactive people who are in employment**.
- £1 million will support projects between £25,000 and £100,000 aimed at inactive people who are far less likely to have a steady income, or any income at all, and face more extreme disadvantage.

Five per cent of the total fund (£150,000) will be used to fund smaller awards between £1,000 and £10,000. This can be used to support the two groups of inactive people described above.

There are 2 workshops are running on Thursday 5th October at the Hamptons Sports and Leisure club, Chelmsford. Kerry McDonald will offer a detailed overview of the fund, what Sport England are looking for in projects, what organisations should apply and the type of partnerships they will support. He will share his top tips and offer support around your project idea. Active Essex team members will also be present to support the development of your project.

## **Connected Communities Innovation Fund**



Nesta and the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) have partnered to deliver the Connected Communities Innovation Fund.

Recently there has been a huge focus on youth social action, as seen through the <u>#iwill</u> campaign. However, Nesta want to ensure that people across the lifecourse have social action opportunities that suit their needs and interests. Funding will be available for innovations that enable a wider group of volunteers to give their time and skills including:

- People aged 50 and over
- People who want to give less intensively
- People who want to connect online

Projects must address the following themes:

- Community connections and thriving places
- Community resilience in emergencies
- Digital Innovation
- Improving our environment

Who can apply: Public services, charities, social enterprises and partnerships. Projects must show how they advance Nesta's <u>charitable objects</u> for public benefit. Maximum grant:

There are two separate funding tracks:

- Early Stage Ideas track: grants of between £50,000 and £75,000, along with non-financial support over 12-18 months to test concepts.
- Growing Great Ideas track: grants of between £100,000 and £250,000, along with two years of non-financial support, are available for innovations already in place and ready to scale.

# Timebanking comes to Basildon & Billericay

BBWCVS has recently taken on the management of the Wickford Timebank project. This, volunteer-led, initiative has been running in Wickford for a number of years.




We are now expanding the Wickford Timebank into a borough-wide Basildon, Billericay & Wickford Timebank so that members can share a wider range of skills and meet a greater number of community needs.

## What is Timebanking?


Timebanking is a means of exchange used to organise people and organisations around a purpose, where time is the principal currency. For every hour participants 'deposit' in a timebank, perhaps by giving practical help and support to others, they are able to 'withdraw' equivalent support in time when they themselves are in need. In each case the participant decides what they can offer.

Everyone's time is equal, irrespective of the skills exchanged. Because timebanks are just systems of exchange, they can be used in an almost endless variety of settings. Traditionally these settings have been divided into three categories:



**Person to Person:** These might be 'standalone' timebanks, perhaps in a local community, where residents might organise social action using the principles of an hour for an hour. This might typically see a timebank member earning a time credit by doing the shopping for an elderly member of the timebank, and then spending that time credit on getting somebody else to provide baby-sitting support at a time when they are busy.

**Person to Organisation:** This model might see organisations using timebanking as a tool for achieving their own outcomes and goals. In this instance, the timebank might be interwoven into the fabric of the organisation, so that their own activities can be organised through a system of time exchange. For example, a hospital might wish to provide a home-care service for patients who have left the acute care setting but are still in need of support –perhaps somebody with a broken leg for example. The hospital would then organise the informal support needed, such as help with cooking meals, doing shopping or running basic errands, using a timebank to incentivise the giving of help rather than paying professionals in the traditional manner.



**Organisation to Organisation:** Timebanks can also work between organisations, as a system for trading assets and resources. Organisations, such as local businesses or public sector agencies, might place access to some of their resources into the timebank. This might be the use of a minibus or sports hall, or particular skills that they have such

as graphic design or legal advice. Organisations in the timebank can then share, trade and exchange a range resources based on the hour for an hour principle.

In reality timebanks are most sustainable when these boundaries are withdrawn, and the three models are brought together. In that way, people, organisations and public services can be brought together in timbanking marketplaces where skills, support and physical assets can be exchanged in an equitable manner.
