

Free Leadership Development Training from March 2020 – Deadline for Applicants 9th December

An exciting free leadership development opportunity from The King's Fund for voluntary and community sector (VCS) organisations working in health and wellbeing.

Cascading Leadership provides an invaluable free opportunity for leaders working in health and wellbeing organisations in the voluntary and community sector (VCS) in the UK to develop their leadership skills and receive practical support.

It is built on a peer-to-peer model where an experienced VCS leader (a consultant) supports another VCS leader who is seeking support (a partner). They meet at least five times over a period of nine months where the partner has an opportunity to work through organisational issues and receive support. The consultant also benefits from being stretched to develop their own leadership and skills, while being supported and supervised by senior staff at The King's Fund. Both roles offer a learning and development opportunity.

The programme aims to create a diverse mix of participants including those from smaller organisations, individuals from minority groups and people from throughout the UK. Applications are especially welcomed from for consultants and partners from Black and minority ethnic communities, as people from these groups have to date been underrepresented on the courses.

National News

THE QUEEN'S SPEECH: WHAT'S IN IT AND WHAT IT MEANS FOR CHARITIES

Health and social care

Mentions of new hospitals and investment as well as a strengthening of the Mental Health Act.

Adult social care also got a mention with the promise to bring forward 'substantive proposals to fix the crisis in social care' is another that charities shouldn't expect to be met in the short-term.

Environment

The speech outlined some more details of a new environment bill. This will set out legally binding targets in areas such as reducing plastics, restoring biodiversity and clean air and water, as well as setting up a new regulator to replace oversight from the EU.

As well as aiming to close the productivity gap, a national infrastructure strategy will also focus on climate change and how the UK can achieve net zero emissions by 2050.

Domestic abuse bill

As part of a package of measures aimed at victims of crime, the domestic abuse bill has been carried over from the previous session. The government has also committed to consulting on a new 'victims' law' in early 2020.

#SafeguardingAsOne - Free Resources for All Charities

This week NCVO has launched a new hub of safeguarding resources, produced with partners including NAVCA, the FSI, NSPCC, Children England and a number of other organisations.

This work forms part of the government's Civil Society Strategy and has been funded by The National Lottery Community Fund and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport. The resources are designed to help all organisations start their safeguarding journey, so they are a safe place for their staff, beneficiaries and volunteers.
