Outstanding Contribution to Community Safety

Roger Hirst, the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner for Essex wants to hear about your community heroes – people from across Essex who make an 'Outstanding Contribution to Community Safety'. Do you know somebody in your community who goes the extra mile to support vulnerable people, prevent crime and make their communities safer? If so then why not nominate them for the award. The process is simple to complete, and winners will be recognised at the PFCC Annual Conference on Thursday, March 15th March 2018 which is being held at Boreham House in Chelmsford.

The winner will receive £500 to go towards their work in the community and two highly commended winners will also receive £300. There will also be a chance for the people of Essex to vote for the winner of a People's Choice category from a shortlist of entrants selected by a judging panel. The People's Choice winner will receive £100.

To win an award, you have to demonstrate that the nominee is an exceptional person or group that have gone above and beyond to keep their community safe. They also have to have delivered a project or scheme that has improved the safety of those around them. Nominees can be volunteers or those who work in a professional capacity, delivering a service to the public to keep people safe, prevent crime and protect the most vulnerable people in our communities.

More details of how to nominate are on the Essex PFCC website. The deadline for nominations is 12 noon on Monday, February 26th. The nomination form is simple to complete, and is attached and can be downloaded from the PFCC website <u>here</u>.

It was discovered that radical action is needed to strengthen local institutions; delegate tangible power resources and control to communities; gain equality in community participation; and deliver change in local government behaviour and practice to enable local initiatives to thrive.

Tracey Crouch named Minister for Loneliness



Tracey Crouch, the existing Charities Minister was last week named Minister for Loneliness and asked to lead on a Commission launched by the late MP, Jo Cox.

The issue of loneliness affects approximately nine million people in the UK and was described by NHS England's chief nursing officer,

Prof Jane Cummings as something that could be 'lethal' in the winter months. Speaking of the new ministerial role, the Prime Minister said it would involve working with the commission, businesses and charities to create a government strategy.

In an interview with BBC Breakfast, Ms Crouch said a multi-million-pound fund would help her pull together existing work being carried out on loneliness to create a framework for the

future. We look forward to hearing more on this and working with the new Minister for Loneliness to share and build on the work that our members are already doing to tackle this issue.
