The purpose of this role is to provide 'Front of house' support for a free weight management drop-in session.

What you'll be doing:

- Meeting and greeting people, offering a warm and friendly welcome to the session.
- Explaining how the programme works (full training will be given)
- Weighing clients & recording their progress
- Handing out relevant supporting materials (leaflets, hand-outs etc.)
- Generally helping to organise the session (sign-in sheets, set-up, checking resources)

We are offering the drop-in session on behalf of Anglian Community Enterprise (ACE) as part of their weight management programme. The service is community-based and designed to support people to achieve a gradual, long term weight loss by weighing in at a variety of community sites, accessing the ACE My Weight Matters online programme.

Community Organisations - Research Opportunities

The NCCPE have announced the 3rd and 4th Community University Partnership Initiative (CUPI) match events. Funded by Power to Change and the Arts and Humanities Research Council, CUPI supports community organisations (including community businesses, charities, social enterprises, and voluntary organisations) and university researchers to create trusting and useful research collaborations which benefit all the partners involved.

Big Lottery Fund



You may be aware that the Prime Minister has announced how the Big Lottery Fund is developing a programme to help young people overcome barriers to employment. Some of you may have already encouraged young people to complete the online survey. The Lottery are now seeking your input on our Stakeholder Survey.

This is part of an engagement phase which will put young people and stakeholders at the centre of designing a £90 million programme to help tackle barriers to employment. The Lottery are working jointly with colleagues from DCMS, DfE and DWP to learn from what young people and organisations tell us and to develop the different options.

Ministers are expected to issue a policy direction to the Big Lottery Fund about what the programme should focus on and what it should achieve in summer 2018. Big Lottery will then engage in a further period of co-design on the specifics of the programme. The Lottery website includes more information in a statement of intent [here](#).

As the next part of this engagement phase they are now conducting a Stakeholder Survey and want help to share this information. They want to hear from as many of your contacts, delivery partners and stakeholders as possible.

The Big Lottery Award have also now made it easier for organisations to apply for national lottery funding by moving away from standardized application forms. It is now a simpler to tell the fund about your project ideas, over the phone, online and in person.
