Anti-knife Crime Community Fund



The fund has been set up to support community projects which reduce knife crime and have a positive impact on young people at risk of carrying a knife and committing crime.

The first round of the fund was launched in October 2017.

The fund is open to voluntary and community sector groups and bids are being invited for funding for projects of up to £30,000, although bids will be considered for greater funding for projects with collaboration between partners.

Bids will be assessed on the extent to which they demonstrate:

- delivery of outcomes to stop knife crime
- proven track record of delivering local interventions
- proven track record of ability to work with children and young people
- proven track record of ability to work in partnership with other organisations and services
- evidence of value for money

The deadline for submissions is 15 June, you can find out more [here](#). Successful organisations will be contacted by the end of July and, providing financial details are provided promptly, will receive the funds in August. The funds are to be spent by 31 March 2019.

Civil Society Strategy Consultation



The CVS membership organization NAVCA would like to give many thanks to all who contributed to the recent Civil Society Strategy consultation. A summary of the resulting response is highlighted below:

Summary: “The overwhelming message that came from our members was not, surprisingly, that they wanted more money in the system (although clearly resourcing is a continuing issue) – but that they wanted to see, contribute to and benefit from a new relationship of trust between the state, as represented both by government and by local statutory bodies, and the voluntary sector.

For too long the sector has been seen as the poor relation, the amateur or the needy partner in that relationship – a perception that does not take account of the vastly innovative, skilled and effective resource the VCS offers.

Above all, the current relationship and the balance of power within it too often means that public resources are wasted or at best used less effectively than they might be whilst communities fail to gain the benefits they are promised or deserve, simply because no-one has genuinely asked, or listened to, the voices of those communities.

It is time for that to change. It is essential that in a post-austerity, post-Brexit and post-Grenfell era, the partnerships that form civil society in its widest sense put aside their long-standing notions of power and find truly effective ways in which to work together, collaboratively, to free up the power of the communities we are all here to serve.”

Based in South Essex, BASIS (www.basissouthessex.org.uk) is a well-established charity working to improve the independence and quality of life of those who have visual impairment, their families and carers. BASIS believes that it is important to raise awareness of the needs of visually impaired people to the sighted community, changing attitudes, thereby bringing both groups to a closer understanding of

The organisation provides a diverse range of activities and support to its beneficiaries. With strong links to Guide Dogs for the Blind, RNIB and the NHS, BASIS offers a unique service provision for the area.

This is an exciting opportunity to get involved with this 20-year-old organisation as it seeks to grow and develop. Until recently BASIS was run by its board of trustees on a voluntary basis. Recent funding has created a number of paid posts to provide operational running of the organisation and enabling the board to take on a more strategic focus. Having secured funding from Big Lottery and undergone a review of governance BASIS is about to embark on a period of growth and development. The new trustees will be able to play a part in this and therefore enjoy making a difference to this organisation, its beneficiaries and shaping its future direction.

The successful candidate must show an understanding of the issues facing blind and partially sighted people.

It is expected that interviews will be held on the week beginning 11th June.
