Health and Social Care Update

NHS England to Boost Social Prescribing With 'Army of Workers'



This week NHS England has <u>announced plans to recruit an</u> <u>'army of workers'</u> as part of plans to ramp up social prescribing.

One thousand social prescribing 'link workers' will be recruited as part of the <u>NHS Long Term Plan</u>. It is hoped that they will handle around 900,000 patient appointments every year, easing pressures on GPs by reducing the number of appointments that are not directly related to medical conditions.

NHS England has reported on the growing evidence that referrals to community services such as exercise or art classes, history groups and ballroom dancing, can boost health and wellbeing more than prescribed medication.

NHS Long Term Plan – Key Themes

Last month saw the release of the NHS's Long Term Plan; which sets out how the NHS will be made fit for the future.

The Plan details the improvements the NHS would like to make over the next decade – from giving every child the best start in life, to improving care for major conditions and helping people to age well - and how it intends to achieve these improvements, addressing the challenges that the NHS faces now.

NAVCA Policy & Research Lead, Amanda Stevens, has written an overview of the key themes in the plan, which is <u>available to our members on NAVCA Connect</u>.

The plan outlines a renewed focus on the prevention agenda, setting targets to avoid 150,000 heart attacks, strokes and dementia cases and stop an estimated 85,000 premature deaths each year. There is an increased focus on joined-up care delivery and collaboration between the NHS and external partners, (including communities and the VCSE sector), to take forward key priorities at local level.

The Plan acknowledges the vital role that volunteers play across all areas of the NHS "from first responders and care companions to trust governors and transport volunteers", and pledges to invest £2.3 million into support for volunteering programmes across the country.

At local level the NHS will be working with non-health partners (local authorities, VCSE organisations and community groups) to develop strategies to cover the next five years, work that will be led by Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships (STPs) and Integrated Care Systems (ICSs).
