BBWCVS Membership Survey - Results

Thank you for those that participated in the 2019 survey. We are delighted that 100% of respondents were satisfied with our services. Participants were asked to rate individual services and encouragingly 80% of respondents said our development advice was very good, with a 99% saying the funding advice was good or very good.

The survey included a section on our communications: Feedback was also positive with 75% of respondent saying they thought the CVS Twitter account was very good, 66% said the newsletter was very good. Also positive was feedback on our Volunteer Centre Facebook and Twitter account, though we continue to enhance these.

Participants were also asked about additional services they would like us to provide. Participants wanted the opportunity to come together more frequently; for us to develop additional and affordable training; and to undertake further partnership work to meet the needs of the area. The advice from our Funding Development service was commented as excellent.
