Training and Development Support

Prince's Trust Young People's Development Awards

Do you know a young person where a financial barrier is preventing them from taking up a job, training or education opportunity?

As we approach September, many young people are considering their next steps but might be limited because they cannot afford travel, clothing, equipment or other requirement to take up a job offer or college place. If so, the young person can apply for a Development Award from The Prince's Trust.

Small cash grants to enable a young person to take up a job offer or training course where there may be a financial barrier. They do not need to be repaid.

Eligibility is age 16 - 30 and the grants are typically £100 - £150.

Examples of eligible items include travel expenses for the first month of a job, equipment required to start a training course or job (e.g. PPE, basic tools, hair and beauty equipment), DBS check, formal ID, interview clothes etc

The process involves a short meeting with us, where an application form is completed. We will need to see evidence of the job offer / college course confirmation and what the purchases are for.

Once approved, we will purchase the item directly for the young person.

We are able to provide access for paid staff in the voluntary and community sector to our job retention support service.


Individual Placement Support Services for those struggling to sustain their employment due to poor mental health, where;

Basildon Emergency Night Shelter Vacancies

We are currently recruiting for the positions of the BENS project coordinator; shelter administrator and night workers (Persons Awake).

Information on these vacancies will be found on the BBWCVS website under the vacancy section.

The aim of the posts will be to set up and ensure the smooth running of the Basildon Emergency Night Shelter provision in Basildon. This is operational from November 2018 until 31 March 2020.

As this is the projects fourth year, you will not be required to set the service up from scratch. Instead you will inherit established venues with a history of delivery, a collection of procedural documents based on good practice, and a supportive project steering group. You will therefore be building upon the success of previous years.

Last year the scheme provided support to nearly 100 guests. This provision was supported by a team of 170 volunteers who provided support during the night sessions.

This winter we will be working with seven venues to provide shelter provision. They are:
