I attended a meeting with a group of local enthusiastic people who have formed an organisation called More in Common Basildon Borough. 'More in Common' is a national concept and now Basildon has its own dedicated group with a vision to build more united, inclusive and resilient societies in which people believe that what they have in common is stronger than what divides them. They believe that this can be achieved by developing an online directory of local activities and services. Yes, it's not the first and I'm sure it won't be the last directory either. However, it is the newest and with support from the Mayor David Burton-Sampson it has a good chance to succeed. The group are very focused on the outcomes and how this can signpost the public to all of the great things happening throughout the borough. So why does another directory get me excited?

I am fixated on how this could potentially impact all of the organisations we support and what a difference a good quality directory could mean for us all. I've had plenty of experiences of developing a successful funding bid, proving the need, coordinating and preparing the services, and then holding my fingers crossed on the big day waiting for participants to arrive. We all know the service users are out there, so I see no harm in a new local directory which will signpost them in our direction. In just a few weeks a flyer promoting the directory will be circulated to all 88,000 homes across the Basildon Borough. The group also intend to develop a selection of public events highlighting all of the opportunities we host across the borough. 'More in Common' are passionate about reducing isolation, and I'm passionate about supporting all of the opportunities we collectively provide as non-profit organisations, a perfect match. BBWCVS have agreed to provide support and encourage its maintenance within our member network. We expect the website to be available very soon and will provide a link on our social media groups. We would then appreciate you providing details of your activities and contact details and then sit back and enjoy the magic!

Advice for Those Interested in Volunteering



Emergency Essentials Programme - BBC Children in Need

Family Fund Business Services are working in collaboration with BBC Children in Need to deliver the Emergency Essentials programme supporting children and young people living with severe poverty as well as additional pressures such as domestic violence, disability or poor health in the family.

The programme can deliver or fund critical items such as:

- Gas or electric cookers
- Essential household items
- Furniture and kitchen equipment
- Children's beds and bedding
- Washing machines
- Fridges and freezers
- Baby equipment
- Clothing in exceptional or emergency situations.

Applications must be completed by a registered referrer who is part of an organisation that is supporting the family or young person and capable of assessing their needs.

Family Fund – The Family Fund Trust for families with severely disabled children

The Family Fund helps families across the UK who are raising a disabled or seriously ill child or young person aged 17 or under. You can apply to Family Fund subject to a number of criteria which include that you are the parent or carer of a disabled or seriously ill child or young person aged 17 or under and that you have evidence of entitlement to one of the following: Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income Support, Incapacity Benefit, Employment Support Allowance, Housing Benefit and Pension Credit.

Funding to Develop the Sustainability of Organisations Working with Unpaid Carers – Closing Date 14th February

The Triangle Trust has announced that the next closing date for applications to its Development grants programme is noon on the 14th February 2020.



During this funding round, the Trust will provide grants to not for profit organisations such as registered charities, not-for-profit social enterprises or community interest companies working with unpaid carers, The Trust would like to see applicants use these grants to enhance their resilience, so that when the grant comes to end the applicant organisation's income will not be reduced. Grants are available from £10,000 to £80,000 over three years with a duration of 6 months to 3 years.

A maximum of £30,000 per year or £2,500 per month for smaller projects can be requested.

The Trust also holds a separate funding round for organisations working with the rehabilitation of offenders or exoffenders. This is due to open for applications in March 2020.

Gregg's Local Community Project Fund - Closing Date 23rd February



The Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust – Funding for Music and Arts Projects for People with Disabilities – Closing Date 28th February

From the 1st February 2020 grants of up to £1,000 will be available to projects that improve access to Music and the Arts for people with physical, learning and mental health disabilities. To be eligible applicants need to be registered charities with an annual income of between £100,000 and £1 million. The funding is being made available through the Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust and the closing date for applications will be the 28th February 2020. https://austin-hope-pilkington.org.uk/

MSE Charity – Funding for Financial Literacy Projects – Closing Date 28th February

The MSE Charity has announced that its grants programme will re-open for applications on the 3rd February 2020. The charity gives grants to not for profit organisations that deliver activities which make a lasting impact on how people think, behave and manage their money.



The MSE Charity is dedicated to supporting UK voluntary groups delivering financial life skills which make a lasting impact on the way people think, behave and manage their money. Grants of up to £5,000 are available for projects that aim to make people living with 'Long Term Challenges' become more financially capable. Grants will be offered to build financial capability by assisting groups who support people living with: dementia; autism; learning difficulties; disabilities; caring responsibilities; mental illness; brain injuries and strokes

Eligible applicants will be registered charities, Community Interest Companies (CICs) and other not for profit companies and Credit Unions. Preference is given to projects that break new ground in approach, delivery or in audience and are either capable of replication to a wider audience and/or are collaborative i.e. working with other organisations in the field, or geographical area as appropriate.

The closing date is the 28th February 2020 or when 40 applications have been received.

The Thomas Wall Trust's Digital Skills 2020 Grant Programme – Closing Date 31st March

The Thomas Wall Trust's Digital Skills 2020 grant programme awards funding of up to £5,000 to not-for-profit organisations and charities aiming to equip those over 18 years old with basic digital skills for work and life, helping them access the online world.

Applicants must have been established for at least three year and have an annual turnover that does not exceed £500,000.

The Trust will prioritise applications that:

- · link digital skills with employment opportunities;
- are match funded;
- · can provide compelling evidence of impact; and
- · are working with collaborative networks.
- Deadline: Tuesday 31 March 2020 (expression of interest)

Leeds Building Society Foundation – Closing Date 27th April



Applications welcomed from UK registered charities with a turnover of less than £1m.

Donations usually fund items of "capital expenditure". That means items must directly help those in need, rather than contributing to the charity's running costs.



National News

National Lottery Funds Charity Evaluation Website

A network set up to help charities prove their effectiveness has been funded by the National Lottery to launch online.

The Charity Evaluation Working Group (CHEW) was set up nine years ago and involves around 400 people representing 120 UK wide charities.

After registering as a community interest organisation last year it has now launched its website presence, after receiving funding through the National Lottery.

The website features a range of online resources and aims to connect evaluation experts to those in the sector with less experience of measuring their organisation's effectiveness. Crowdfunder Brings in Fee Free Fundraising

Online fundraising provider Crowdfunder has overhauled its payments structure to axe all transaction and platform fees for charities.

The fundraising platform's fee changes see any donations received via Crowdfunder administered by the Charities Trust. This includes Gift Aid.

Instead supporters will be asked if they want to offer a financial "tip" to the platform to cover costs, but this will be optional.

"Every penny raised for charity should go to charity," said Crowdfunder Creative Director Simon Deverell.
